TECH TALK with John Dodson

Before I get started on this months tech talk. I need to make a little correction in last months article. There was a sentence that read. Just leave the tires hanging. It should have read <u>Don't</u> leave the tires hanging. This was in reference to storing your car.

This months tech talk is on car painting. One of the most difficult decisions I have had to make. Is choosing someone to paint my car. There are allot of paint and body shops in town. But few will give you a professional job. And it really depends on what kind of paint job you want. Do you want a looks good from 20 feet away, a looks good up close, or a "where did you get that paint job." Most of you are like me. You don't have the experience to do the job yourself. So you are at the mercy of others. And the biggest factor of all is how much you want to pay. Paint jobs range from the Earl Scheibs 295 Dollars to a restoration shops 3000 dollars. And that's with no body work.

But who do you choose, to do the work on the classic mopar. As the saying goes. A man's past dictates his future work. Im not saying improvement cant be made. But I know some body shop guys that couldn't paint 20 years ago and they still cant.

Just to give you an example. I have a Dodge Charger R.T. The car is ready for some paint and body work. The body just needs some fine tuning before painting. Body shops cant give you an estimate without looking at your car. So I decided to drive the old R.T. into work. Take off early and get some estimates. No problem. Wrong. I almost choked to death on the fumes coming from inside the trunk area. The tail lights were out for painting. I got off early and off I went. My first stop, was a friend of mine that I attend church with. I have seen his work and though he would do a good job. His estimate was 3000 dollars. I hope he didnt see the shock on my face. I liked to fell out. My feelings were hurt. 3000 dollars. Has it been that long since I got a car painted. My next stop was more in the price range. 1200 was his estimate. But his shop looked like a disaster area. He had a car he had just painted outside. One look at the work and I said, I'll think about it. That's what people say just to be nice. Even though they may never come back. The next stop was a fellow mopar painter. Ive seen his work and knew it to be good. But he wasnt at his shop. By now, I have had enough of the fumes. I stopped to buy some duck tape. I taped up the tail lights, side lights and deck lid. I smell like an exhaust pipe. The next estimal was 3300 dollars. Maybe my church buddy wasnt that far off. The professional restoration shop wanted 4500 and had a waiting period of 8 months. You may have guest, they wont be waiting for my car. To much for this country boy. I was looking for a 2000 dollar figure, that I didnt find that day. I drove the old R.T. home. Duck tape and all. Another general rule is you pay for what you get. Dont always go for the cheapest bid. That paint is hard to get off, after it's applied. I can report that I did find someone to paint the car and at a fare price.

I offer this advice.

- 1. Go to local car shows. Find the quality of paint you are looking for. Ask who painted it and the condition it was in. If you got a little more brass. Ask how much they charged.
- 2. Check out the shop. Does it look like a tornado has just left. Most shops are a little messy. But the area where the cars are painted needs to be very clean. A clean paint booth is very important. I have seen some show quality paint jobs that were pained in common house garage. But that is the exception and not the rule.
- 3. Ask for references. You want to see the quality of work. A man in the business should surly have references.
- 4. Decide in advance, how far you want to go. Do you want a patch panel installed, or half gallon of bondo. Do you want lacquer primer or epoxy primmer. Do you want acrylic or base coat clear. Do you want a 95+ point show car or a nice street restoration.
- 5. Ask him how long he has been in business. Where did he learn his trade?
- 6. Ask if insured.
- 7. Ask a club member, that has a paint job you like, Who did the work.
- 8. Get a general idea of how much you want to spend.
- 9. Pray about who does the job. God pays attention to details.

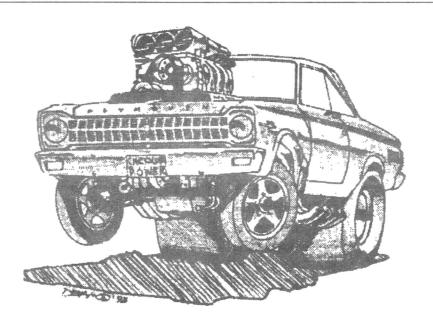
Don't forget - Elections of Your Club Officers take place at the Jan. meeting!! If you want to vote you must be there.
