

Rev. Mopar Grease Pit

We've all heard a great deal about the Keith Black Hypereutectic pistons that are currently available for Chrysler applications. There are many who feel that these are just a fancy, polished, aluminum cast piston and not nearly as good as a forged unit. Many even pretend to know what the word hypereutectic means when in actuality, most do not. But there's so much to the concept that it bears study. Our lesson for this month is taken from the catalog of Black, chapters 1 and 2, and from sources close to the development of more products based on this concept.


First, what's in a name... Hypereutectic, what does it mean? I sure as goodness didn't know until I had it clarified. When Aluminum and Silicon are combined into an alloy, there is a saturation point beyond which the silicon will no longer be absorbed into the Aluminum. Keith Black likens this to sugar in iced tea, then the rest settles to the bottom and has no effect on the sweetness unless it remains suspended by some means, usually stirring... The point at which Aluminum stops absorbing silicon is called the eutectic. The word hypereutectic is actually a compound word with hyper being the prefix. What hypereutectic means is that in the casting process MORE silicon is mixed with the Aluminum than it can absorb and the excess is suspended in the casting itself. The eutectic of Aluminum is 11 - 12% and the Black pistons are made up of 16-18% silicon. Through heat treating the T-6 process, these pistons are 30% stronger than eutectic or hypereutectic pistons. Enough science, how do they work?

Engines build with these little devils require attention that you might not lavish on a forged piston rebuild, but the attention to detail will yield some startling results. The first little detail has to do with clearances... When I say little, I mean little. The clearances are tight on these babies. Try wall clearance of .0015" to .002"... This promotes a tight seal for good efficiency and a straight wobble free piston travel. The second detail has to do with the top ring gap. HUGE by most rebuild standards because of the higher position of the top ring on the piston and because the pistons hold heat only at the top... (unlike any other current design). The third detail has to do with quench height. These pistons are designed for a quench height of .040" with gasket. Any attempt to decrease the compression by milling the pistons will result in MORE ping and less power. Here you just have to trust the manufacturer and go with the piston that best suits your compression needs. In speaking with the "rolling test bed" for KB, a 212" rear engined dragster with a 377 C.I.D. Chevy and an 8-71 blower. Rev. Mopar Racing Engines has learned still more secrets for power. In fact, I was told of one little modification that yielded this team some 36 horsepower of a dyno pull. They ran one pull, took a reading, mad the modification, made a second pull and, viola, 36 horsepower... Not believing what happened they did a third and fourth pull and the average was a 35.3 horsepower gain... ALL FOR FREE... For them to share this kind of knowledge with another racer is rare, but I am one of the first interested MOPAR racers to ever ask about the possibilities and they want imput from all major brands. I am currently working on another 451 (like I detailed in Grease Pit two months ago). My quarter junior tells me that we can expect well over 575 honest horsepower from the new combination at a cost about \$1000 less that our first 451... Not bad.

The big ticket for the KB Hypereutectics is the 360 and various permutations of that particular engine. They have four different pistons for this "base" one of which is a stroker piston. For the big block, they have a stroker piston for the 400 block/440 crank combination. Since this is a shelf item, it's cheap. It is also quite streetable with the right heads and cam. These pistons feature a reverse dome for open chamber heads and the dome is milled for the closed chamber heads. I have a set right next to me as I write this and I'm here to tell you they are a "pretty" product and they are indeed super light.

In the days ahead I will be building a 440 for club member Bill Bradley, using the KB Hypereutectic pistons. His is based on a straight 440 build but his pistons are much lighter than the ones I put in my project 440. And what with the tricks I've learned, Bill's will more than likely be significantly more powerful than mine. Thank the good Lord I have a lighter car... Bill's engine should produce an honest 400-415 horsepower with a 750 C.F.M. carb. Not only that, he will do it with half a point less compression than my TRW forged piston engine. I may have to build another for myself. I have been won over by the product, no doubt. I can honestly say that they will NOT replace forged racing pistons in many applications, but when an application can use one, I will feel confident that I can use them without worry.

I have established a good contact with the KB folks and if any of you are interested in purchasing some of these units or having Rev. Mopar Racing Engines build you an engine using them, feel free to contact me. They would be great for a restoration since no one can see the inside of the engine anyway. They will give you the compression of old without the ping and knock. Can you dig it... At last a product that answers MANY needs simply...
