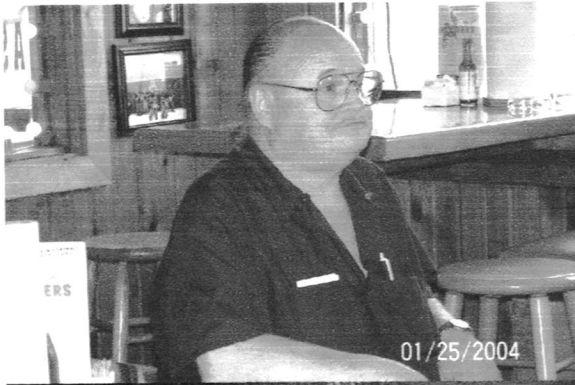

Dogs are man's best friend. But although dad had these he desired to be out messing with a car, going to a car show or even a club meeting. My dad will always be part of a MOPAR because some of his ashes are inside the stone. He would sure get a kick out of that.*
