



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CHET BIGGERS • ASHLAND CITY, TN 1970 PLYMOUTH AAR 'CUDA

The concept of muscle cars that can handle corners was not invented with the protouring street machine movement. Way back in the original muscle car heyday there were enthusiasts who wanted to do more than just blast in a straight line down the quarter mile; they aspired to attack corners the same way they saw professionals performing in the Trans Am road racing series.

For Plymouth, the offering to these enthusiasts was the AAR Cuda, named after Dan Gurney's All-American Racers team that campaigned Barracudas in SCCA racing. Building the AAR Cuda (and the companion Challenger T/A from Dodge) helped mother Mopar qualify

its offerings for production competition road racing classes. The AAR package included a 290hp 340c.i. engine with a trio of Holley two-barrel carbs atop an aluminum Edelbrock intake, all sucking air through a functional scoop in a fiberglass hood. A heavy-duty suspension, quick-ratio steering, and power front disc brakes were part of the package, as was special striping, front and rear spoilers, side exhaust, and 15-inch Rallye wheels with E60-15 front and G60-15 rear Goodyear

Polyglas tires. Chet Biggers always wanted an AAR Cuda

and found this one in Florida in 2013, where it had been stored indoors for 35 years by a previous owner who'd intended to restore it. Chet spent the next five years bringing it back to life. He found an original 340 TA block and had Chuck Vaughn rebuild it to factory specifications. It sends power through an A833 four-speed to a 3.55:1-geared Sure Grip rearend.

Chet tackled much of the body and paint work himself. "I painted most of the car in a two-car garage," Chet said, "with the body being painted in a spray booth." He got help from his father, Paul Biggers, using PPG base coat/clear coat materials to reproduce the bold FE5 Rallye Red finish. It's contrasted nicely with the AAR's signature strobe stripes





and flat black fiberglass hood.

The same attention to factory-correct details was given to the interior, where an original Rallye gauge package fills the dash, a pistol-grip shifter graces the center console, and a three-spoke woodgrain wheel keeps everything pointed in the right direction. The black vinyl bucket seats are just as Plymouth intended.

Making this Mopar restoration even more special is the fact that it was performed mostly by its owner. "This was my dream car as a kid," Chet said, "but it never would have taken place if it weren't for my dad teaching me about paint and body and not running from hard work."
